





2nd/3rd February 2019 Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

This is Name Tag Sunday

No, it's not a gimmick. Sometimes we sit beside people in Church week in week out and never introduce ourselves. It's an icebreaker if you like.

The name you have received at birth and baptism has been your constant companion. It is very much part of our identity, not just on documentation like a driving licence but especially in expressing our own unique identity. Do you see yourselves as others do? Very unlikely I would say and we see that tension played out in the scriptures too. Jesus had a clear idea of who he was and his mission, those in authority felt very ill at ease with it. If we meet someone for the first time, irrespective of their name, we are far more likely to accept them just as they are than if we had a commentary from a third party.

In today's second reading, St Paul reminds us that as a child, he talked like a child, thought like a child, argued like a child, but now that he is an adult all childish ways are behind him. Even now he accepts that his knowledge and thus his behaviour is imperfect but when he allows unselfish love to rule as in Gospel values – that is the world to which we are called – “Love one another as I have loved you” (John 13:34-35). That is our true identity.
